The Word of God tells us that man lives his life from the inside out and therefore should guard his heart (the innermost sanctuary of the mind) above all else.

Proverbs 4:23

Keep thy heart with all diligence; for out of it *are* the issues of life.

Matthew 12:35

A good man out of the good treasure of the heart bringeth forth good things: and an evil man out of the evil treasure bringeth forth evil things.

We hear people say that so and so has a "good heart." This is often the declaration in the face of an admittedly evil or reprehensible deed. According to

what Jesus Christ said it is the <u>contents</u> of the heart that make for the production of both good and evil.

Mark 7:18-23

And he saith unto them, Are ye so without understanding also? Do ye not perceive, that whatsoever thing from without entereth into the man, it cannot defile him;

Because it entereth not into his heart, but into the belly, and goeth out into the draught, purging all meats?

And he said, That which cometh out of the man, that defileth the man.

For from within, out of the heart of men, proceed evil thoughts, adulteries, fornications, murders,

Thefts, covetousness, wickedness, deceit, lasciviousness, an evil eye, blasphemy, pride, foolishness:

All these evil things come from within, and defile the man.

A youngsters mind does not have the capability of discernment necessary to deal with such a harsh deluge of filth. Make no mistake, adults do not walk away unscathed either. Your mind becomes so desensitized to pain and suffering (the experts call it experience replacement or depravation) that somehow justification is seen in countless abhorrent acts of murder and crueltv. The movie industry has invented ways to torment that would make the Marquis De Sade ashamed. The age of the "dark hero" is a blight on society as are the "wonderful" special effects which dazzle us so.

Still, movie makers continue to deny any culpability. Yes mother, movies do inspire violent acts and they have made us into a nation rife with lusts like the one which gave birth to the gladiatorial arena. We need heart transplants ASAP!
