Sin In The Garden, Drugs In The Valley by Linus A. Mathis III

God's purpose for creation is made clear to us in the opening passages of His Word. The heavens and all they contain were created for the express purpose of supporting the earth. God went to great lengths to make this orb inhabitable. He richly garnished her surface with vegetation and made her to bristle with life. He bathed her in water and lovingly enveloped her with a sweet and opulent oxygen based atmosphere. Both are requisite for life and found no where else in such abundance.

Genesis 1:31a And God saw every thing that he had made, and, behold *it was* very good.

As the Serpent did Eve, some endeavor to beguile our children and corrupt their minds from the simplicity that is in Christ. They often defend their lies and abuse of controlled substances by alleging God's approval, e.g. "If God didn't want you to smoke marijuana it wouldn't grow from the ground." "It's O.K. 'cause it's natural." Yeah, right! Cursed ground, thorns and thistles, remember! Drugs in the Valley, kids, won't help you any more than sin in the Garden helped Adam and Eve. The only way to bring joy into your life (if it's lacking) is to bring God into it. Fellowship with God, NOT drugs or alcohol, is the key to a joyful life.
