The Greatest

A gift is something that's voluntarily transferred from one party to another, without any obligation to compensate. In fact, it's common practice to measure the love of the giver by the cost of the gift, i.e., I give you a diamond, I love you very much. I give you a box of candy, I love you, but not so much since a box of candy is much less expensive than a diamond (albeit more affordable and tasty). But don't feel bad if you've been wont to feel this way because we've all been indoctrinated to do so. An especially easy task as the nature we inherited from Adam has a penchant for selfgratification. The carnal mind wouldn't dream of giving a gift to someone who didn't "deserve" it. But, then it wouldn't be a gift, would it? After all, if you "deserve" something you've earned it, you warrant it, you rate it by merit. A gift, well that's undeserved. Carnality then, doesn't give gifts.

A number of years ago I was given the following:

For God - the greatest lover so loved - to the greatest degree the world, - the greatest number that he gave - the greatest act his only begotten son, - the greatest gift that whosoever - the greatest invitation believeth - the greatest simplicity in him - the greatest person should not perish - the greatest deliverance but - the greatest difference have - the greatest certainty everlasting life - the greatest possession John 3:16

Isn't that spectacular? Our God is so magnificent, so wonderful, so awesome! He truly is the Greatest of the great. To think that He didn't even withhold His Son. Why? Because He is the greatest lover and He has loved and does love to the greatest degree. None of us could ever love Him more than He loves us. His act of giving is out of all proportion to any other. The greatest of all acts ever executed even unto eternity. His gift! Jesus Christ!!! If added together, all the riches of all the ages would not even rise to the level of pallid in the face of our Lord's brilliance. He, Jesus Christ, is the unblemished Lamb of God. I John 2:25

And this is the promise that he hath promised us, *even* eternal life.

Titus 1:2

John 3:16b

Romans 6:23

You can't put everlasting life in a test tube. It can't be manufactured or bought. It's free

because God paid for it with the life of His Son.

Ephesians 2:1-10

And you hath he quickened, who were dead in trespasses and sins;

Wherein in time past ye walked according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air, the spirit that now worketh in the children of disobedience:

Among whom also we all had our conversation in times past in the lusts of our flesh, fulfilling the desires of the flesh and of the mind; and were by nature the children of wrath, even as others.

But God, who is rich in mercy, for his great love wherewith he loved us,

Even when we were dead in sins, hath quickened us together with Christ, (by grace ye are saved;)

And hath raised us up together, and made us sit together in heavenly places in Christ Jesus:

That in the ages to come he might shew the exceeding riches of his grace in *his* kindness toward us through Christ Jesus.

For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: *it is* the gift of God:

Not of works, lest any man should boast.

For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God hath before ordained that we should walk in them.

As familiar to me as the above passage is, I just can't read it enough. How about you? This Word of God is so fantastic, so fabulous, you simply just cannot over do it. The truths contained in Ephesians 2:1-10 are breathtaking, stunning and without question, life changing. Our God is the greatest!

The New English Bible:

Romans 5:15-17

But God's act of grace is out of all proportion to Adam's wrongdoing. For if the wrongdoing of that one man brought death upon so many, its effect is vastly exceeded by the grace of God and the gift that came to so many by the grace of the one man, Jesus Christ.

And again, the gift of God is not to be compared in its effect with that one man's sin; for the judicial action, following upon the one offence, issued in a verdict of condemnation, but the act of grace, following upon so many misdeeds, issued in a verdict of acquittal.

For if by the wrongdoing of that one man death established its reign, through a single sinner, much more shall those who receive in far greater measure God's grace, and his gift of righteousness, live and reign through the one man, Jesus Christ.

WOW!!! What a great God we have. He took us from the dregs, a position worthy of death, to the heights of reigning with Christ. Do you know who reigns? Kings reign. Queens reign. Princes and princesses reign. From beggars awaiting execution to

eternal life with the King of Kings and Lord of Lords. God is the greatest!

Deuteronomy 6:6,7

Ephesians 6:4

Proverbs 11:24,25

There is that scattereth, and yet increaseth; and *there is* that withholdeth more than is meet, but *it tendeth* to poverty.

The liberal soul shall be made fat: and he that watereth shall be watered also himself.

Proverbs 19:17

He that hath pity upon the poor lendeth unto the LORD; and that which he hath given will he pay him again.

Proverbs 22:9

He that hath a bountiful eye shall be blessed; for he giveth of his bread to the poor.

Proverbs 28:27

He that giveth unto the poor shall not lack: but he that hideth his eyes shall have many a curse.

Give the gift of gifts, the Word of God. When the Father gave His best, He gave His Son. His Son is THE Word in the flesh, the ultimate gift!

John 1:14
