Leave It Alone, It Doesn't Belong To You

We humans have a penchant for interfering with things that don't concern us. "Put that down; that's not yours; don't touch that;" are all common childhood admonitions. This early inclination to tamper speaks loudly regarding human nature. A conscientious parent acknowledges the potential danger this behavior (when left unchecked) poses for children. But what about trespassing adults?

I Thessalonians 4:11

And that ye study to be quiet, and to do your own business, and to work with your own hands, as we commanded you;

I Peter 4:14,15

If ye be reproached for the name of Christ, happy *are ye*; for the spirit of glory and of God resteth upon you: on their part he is evil spoken of, but on your part he is glorified.

But let none of you suffer as a murderer, or as a thief, or as an evildoer, or as a busybody in other men's matters.

This should really arrest our attention. Note the company a busybody keeps, i.e. murderer, thief, evildoer - (a nefarious grouping to say the least). Clearly then, God's people should tend to their own affairs and not "stick their noses" into other peoples business. If it isn't yours, leave it alone!

II Thessalonians 3:6-15

Now we command you, brethren, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that ye withdraw yourselves from every brother that walketh disorderly, and not after the tradition which he received of us.

For yourselves know how ye ought to follow us: for we behaved not ourselves disorderly among you;

Neither did we eat any man's bread for nought; but wrought with labour and travail night and day, that we might not be chargeable to any of you:

Not because we have not power, but to make ourselves an ensample unto you to follow us.

For even when we were with you, this we commanded you, that if any would not work, neither should he eat.

For we hear that there are some which walk among you disorderly, working not at all, but are busybodies.

Now them that are such we command and exhort by our Lord Jesus Christ, that with quietness they work, and eat their own bread.

But ye, brethren, be not weary in well doing.

And if any man obey not our word by this epistle, note that

man, and have no company with him, that he may be ashamed.

Yet count him not as an enemy, but admonish him as a brother.

Please note -- we never treat a fellow Christian as an enemy. However, it's foolish to continue to "pal" around with someone who abandons the Scripture in favor of sin. Should we be found doing so we would be guilty of having fellowship with the sin of another. This would be true even if we hadn't sinned after the similitude of their transgression.

The following outlines the appropriate course of action:

Galatians 6:1-10

Brethren, if a man be overtaken in a fault, ye which are spiritual, restore such an one in the spirit of meekness; considering thyself, lest thou also be tempted.

Bear ye one another's burdens [baros = a transferrable weight], and so fulfil the law of Christ.

For if a man think himself to be something, when he is nothing, he deceiveth himself.

But let every man prove his own work, and then shall he have rejoicing in himself alone, and not in another.

For every man shall bear his own burden [phortion = non-transferable weight or responsibility].

Let him that is taught in the word communicate unto him that teacheth in all good things.

Be not deceived; God is not mocked: for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap.

For he that soweth to his flesh shall of the flesh reap corruption; but he that soweth to the Spirit shall of the Spirit reap life everlasting.

And let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not.

As we have therefore opportunity, let us do good unto all men, especially unto them who are of the household of faith.

If we are to be involved in the affairs of others it should be for good. Should we observe a brother or sister in error our goal must be to help them set things right. There is no doubt, tattlers, talebearers and busybodies are outside the Will of the Lord.

Proverbs 20:19

He that goeth about *as* a talebearer revealeth secrets: therefore meddle not with him that flattereth with his lips.

Proverbs 24:21

My son, fear thou the LORD and the king: and meddle not with them that are given to change [role players, acting as someone other than who they are, i.e., hypocrites]:

Being a meddler in the affairs or actions of others can get us into a heap of trouble.

Proverbs 26:17

He that passeth by, and meddleth with strife belonging not to him, is

like one that taketh a dog by the ears.

Imagine, if you will, what it would be like to engage a Doberman Pinscher by the ears! For starters, Fido would NOT like this. Consequently, he would become enraged. Since you're holding him by the ears you're as close to the action as possible. You dare not let him go, for the moment you do he will inflict you with a vicious bite. He may not even stop there. He may go on to rip and rend and . . . well, you get the picture! So there you are, between the proverbial "rock and a hard place." Yup, one foot on a banana peel and the other in a grave. You dare not let the pooch go as the cost for doing so is more than you wish to pay. Yet, you cannot stay this way forever! The point is, once you meddle in strife there's no quick, painless way out. Oh no! It's a very hurtful and protracted experience, one you'll likely not soon forget. The solution? Don't meddle! Leave it alone, it doesn't belong to you.

Proverbs 20:3

It is an honour for a man to cease from strife: but every fool will be meddling.

Proverbs 18:6

A fool's lips enter into contention, and his mouth calleth for strokes [a beating].

II Timothy 2:23,24

But foolish and unlearned questions avoid, knowing that they do gender strifes.

And the servant of the Lord must not strive; but be gentle unto all *men*, apt to teach, patient,

It's good to help people, God loves that! But, He sure doesn't approve of strife and meddling. What He has given us we are to freely enjoy. But, November/December 2001

what doesn't belong to us we are to leave alone. So many dos and only a few don'ts.

Consider Adam and Eve. God gave them dominion over all the Earth with only ONE "hands off" stipulation.

Genesis 1:28

And God blessed them, and God said unto them, Be fruitful, and multiply, and replenish the earth, and subdue it: and have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over every living thing that moveth upon the earth.

Genesis 2:16,17

And the LORD God commanded the man, saying, Of every tree of the garden thou mayest freely eat:

But of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, thou shalt not eat of it: for in the day that thou eatest thereof thou shalt surely die.

As we know all too well, they disobeyed God and partook of the fruit of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. The rest, as we say, is history. And man has been a meddlesome busybody ever since, sticking his nose in where it doesn't belong and suffering the consequence because of it. Why? Vengeance belongs to God:

Romans 12:17-21

Recompense to no man evil for evil. Provide things honest in the sight of all men.

If it be possible, as much as lieth in you, live peaceably with all men.

Dearly beloved, avenge not yourselves, but *rather* give place unto wrath: for it is written, Vengeance is mine; I will repay, saith the Lord.

Therefore if thine enemy hunger, feed him; if he thirst, give him drink: for in so doing thou shalt heap coals of fire on his head.

Be not overcome of evil, but overcome evil with good.

God can turn ANY lemon into lemonade for us IF we do things His way. No other way will do! Evil cannot triumph over good when God's Will is exercised. Never, ever take revenge. Vengeance belongs to God, not man!!!

God requires the past:

Ecclesiastes 3:15

That which hath been is now; and that which is to be hath already been; and God requireth that which is past.

Philippians 3:13,14

Brethren, I count not myself to have apprehended: but *this* one thing *I do*, forgetting those things which are behind, and reaching forth unto those things which are before,

I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus.
